Adjectives, Nouns, and Verbs

PreK-2nd grades

3rd-5th grades

Play the Adjective Game (The rule is participants are to describe themselves using one word that begins with the letter of their first name.)





Left & Right/Directions & Names of Steps

PreK-2nd Grade

Make up a story with Left & Right in the story! Bonus: Add the children's names in the story.

3rd-5th Grade

Use a song like <u>Cha Cha Slide</u> that gives the directions in the song (Reference: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=EWBLyKB9Ok8&list=RDEWBLyKB9Ok8&start_radio=1)

- Give the children wooden dowels (Cheaper than drums)!

Sampling ALL AGES

Sampling is one of the best resources to teach history and social science concepts

Sampling refers to artists using other people works to create their works.

Lawsuits are filed when the artists did not have permission to use the other people works. For example, Bruno Mars was sued three times for his song, <u>Uptown Funk</u> (Reference: https://www.nme.com/news/music/mark-ronson-bruno-mars-sued-again-uptown-funk-sequence-funk-you-up-2198882)
